Throughout our 80 year history, Vision Loss Alliance of New Jersey has empowered people with vision loss and blindness by providing support, education, and training in assistive technology and independent living skills.

STORY AND MISSION

We started as a summer camp program for the blind. Now, we're helping people with profound vision loss navigate and educate the world around them.

Our origins trace back 80 years ago in New Jersey, in 1943. A group of individuals came together at a residential camp for blind women and met in a Newark basement to discuss the societal biases experienced by people who are blind and who have profound vision loss. Their discussion planted the starting seeds of our organization and sparked an immediate desire for change that later led to the formation of the New Jersey Association for the Blind.

At the time, our founders focused solely on women's needs because women were underprivileged and had fewer options for leading an independent life. As time progressed, we realized that providing tools to promote independence was key to helping individuals with profound vision loss.

In 2005, we sought to expand our mission and make our services available to more people. So, we sold our large property and decentralized our program model. We began opening program locations in additional counties in 2010 and started offering a full continuum of programs in Denville, with select programs in Ridgewood. We even started offering virtual classes in 2020 to provide support and address all the challenges people with profound vision loss experienced as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

As we look to the future, we're full of optimism and hope. Vision Loss Alliance of New Jersey will continue to provide a lifeline to all those with profound vision loss. We'll also continue to serve as a safe haven where the needs of those with vision loss and blindness are understood and their dignity is acknowledged as we guide them through programs that will help them lead a more independent life.
